Mae M. Ngai is a U.S. legal and political historian interested in questions of immigration, citizenship, and nationalism. She is author of the award winning *Impossible Subjects: Illegal Aliens and the Making of Modern America* (2004) and *The Lucky Ones: One Family and the Extraordinary Invention of Chinese America* (2010). She is now working on *Yellow and Gold: The Chinese Mining Diaspora, 1848-1908*, a study of Chinese gold miners and racial politics in the nineteenth-century California, the Australian colony of Victoria, and the South African Transvaal.
