

[For Students] In order to prevent spread of Novel Coronavirus (Covid-19) infection

Novel Coronavirus (Covid-19) infection disease is one of the “Infectious Diseases Prevented in School” and students who fall under one of the following A to C are **not allowed to attend school**.

[Those with any of the following symptoms]

[Those who had contact with an infected person]

[Those within 14 days of arriving in Japan]

- A**
- ① One or more of: severe symptoms such as shortness of breath (breathing difficulty), strong feeling of tiredness (fatigue) or high fever
 - ② Those likely to develop severe illness (*1) or pregnant women with relatively minor cold-like symptoms such as fever and cough
 - ③ Those other than above who have persistent (4 days or more) relatively mild cold-like symptoms such as fever and cough, or who believe the symptoms to be severe

- B**
- If you had close contact with an infected person (*2)

- C**
- When less than 14 days have passed since arrival in Japan, regardless of presence or absence of symptoms

First report to university and careful health management

Report to the office of your affiliated faculty or graduate school by phone or e-mail, without visiting the office, by the next business day of the office after you first identified the symptom(s) or after the day you potentially had close contact with an infected person.

Consult with the Covid-19 Consultation Center, or consult with or visit your local clinic

First report to university and careful health management

Regardless of whether or not you have symptoms, monitor your health status (by checking body temperature etc.) without coming to campus for at least 14 days after arrival in Japan. If C applies to you, report to the office of your affiliated faculty/graduate school by phone or e-mail on the day of arrival in Japan or by the next business day of the office.

Need to visit referred medical institution or testing center: **Yes**

Need to visit referred medical institution or testing center: **No**

If you fall under **A B** within 14 days of entering Japan

If 14 days have passed with no symptoms

Visit “Covid-19 referred medical institution” or “Covid-19 testing center,” PCR test, etc.

Report to university

Be sure to report the results of consultation with the consultation center or the local clinic to the office of your affiliated faculty/graduate school before resuming attending school.

Follow the flow for the above **A B**

Report to university

Be sure to report the results of health monitoring to the office of your affiliated faculty/graduate school before resuming attending school.

If you test Positive

Follow the instructions of a medical institution.

If you test Negative

Continue to stay home (without coming to campus) until you become asymptomatic and the testing laboratory confirms that there is no possibility of infection.

Report to university

Be sure to report the results to the office of your affiliated faculty/graduate school by its next business day, and keep the university updated with your latest situation.

Report to university

After you become asymptomatic and receive confirmation of the testing laboratory or a medical institution that there is no possibility of infection, be sure to report the results to the office of your affiliated faculty/graduate school by its next business day before resuming attending school.
