How to Use Article Linker

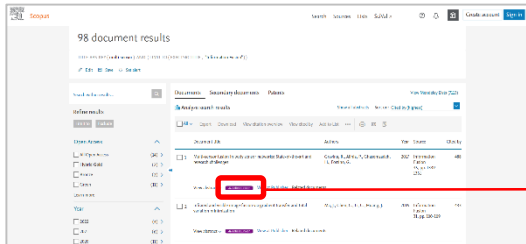
What is Article Linker?

Article Linker is a service that navigates you from the search results of a secondary literature database (searching articles and papers) to the full texts. If full text is not available, you can refer to the links to other databases including DOORS and Google Scholar.

Where can I use it?

- On DOGS Plus, clicking the hyperlinked URL in the search result page will redirect you to the corresponding page on Article Linker.
- There should be an icon  on the search result page on a secondary literature database linked with the university. Clicking this icon will redirect you to the corresponding page on Article Linker.

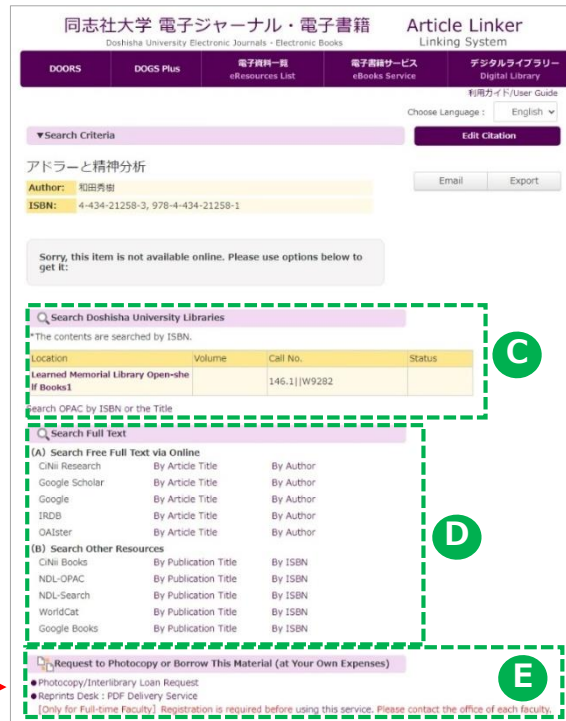

A Search Criteria

Citation information of the electronic resource is displayed.

★How to save the search results

Email

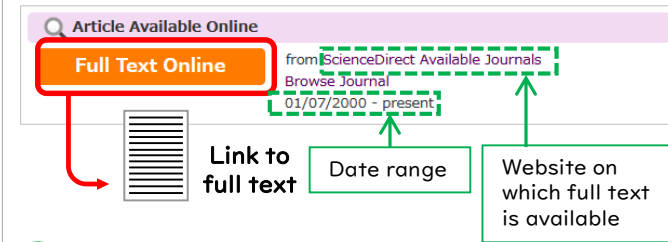
Select a citation style, enter your name, email address and subject and click the "Send Email" button.

Export

Select an output style such as RefWorks and click the "Export" button. If you select Plain Text or HTML, choose a citation style from the pull-down menu.

B Article Available Online

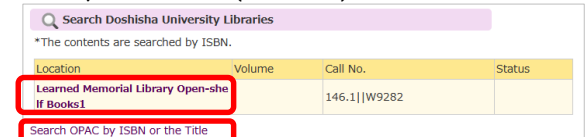
Clicking the link to the full text will redirect you to the corresponding page for the electronic resource.



C Search Doshisha University Libraries

If the university has the item in its collection, its holding information is displayed.

Click Location to view the search results on the university's OPAC (DOORS).



Click " Search OPAC by ISSN/ISBN or the Title" to search again within the university's collection.

D Search Full Text
